It's April, and we're celebrating Parkinson's Awareness Month, which focuses on education about the disease. There are still segments of the population where Parkinson's isn't fully understood, which makes facing it incredibly scary. But even in places that are beginning to label Parkinson's disease and its symptoms, a lot of fear and judgment is associated with the disease. Not only does Parkinson's wreak havoc on the body, it also has tremendous social repercussions. It is relatively common for people with Parkinson's to withdraw from social circles, hiding the illness from friends and family.

A tremendous stigma surrounds the disease because of misinformation or a lack of information. Providing access to facts reduces the stigma that is associated with having an illness. By supporting education and more conversations, we can better shed some light on the disease.

Parkinson's is a neurodegenerative disorder. Over time, this slowly progressing condition causes tremors, gait and balance issues, limb stiffness or rigidity and a slow muscle movement. While each person responds differently to the disease, complications often become serious.

There is no cure, and more research is needed. National Parkinson's Awareness Month every April encourages us to support further research, continue the conversation, increase access to information, and reduce the stigma of Parkinson's!

SPOTLIGHT ON OUR RESIDENT Lee F.

Lee F. was born in the 1950's in Los Angeles. His parents were Jewish immigrants from Austria escaping the horrors of World War II. He is an only child and was typically a happy-go-lucky kid growing up in Hollywood, but his life's

kryptonite has been the ability to breathe normally without any issues - something many others take for granted. His breathing issues lead him on a unique path in life that was anything but mundane. One of Lee's fondest memories from childhood was being able to drive around the town with one of the delivery service trucks offered to neighborhoods back then: The Weber's Bread Truck. He also recalls the excitement, like rolling thunder, from all the kids in the neighborhood upon hearing the approaching jingle of the ice cream truck!

In school, Lee was an avid reader since his father had turned him onto reading at an early age. His favorite things to read were Reader's Digest and comic books. He spent great portions of his life reading as a result of spending many days in multiple treatment centers for his breathing problems, including Kaiser Sunset Children's Hospital, Sun-Air, and even a Jewish Hospital that specialized in Asthma. In his college years, he would take the bus down to his friends house in Hollywood to play Dungeons and Dragons, while on other days he would venture off to a pizza joint near Fairfax that bikers would frequent, where he got to hear all about their intriguing life stories.

He attended Los Angeles Valley College in Van Nuys, where he studied Anthropology and convinced one of his instructors to allow him to do an independent study, which was rare for a junior college to allow. He transferred to Long Beach State where he studied Journalism and Photography -two skills that have served him well his entire lifebefore transferring to California State University Northridge, where he obtained his BA. During these years, Lee dabbled in painting, roofing, editing newspapers, working in a photo lab (where they luckily for press kits for upcoming movies), and even acting. He was on the show Night Court, and would travel to Warner Brothers for rehearsal 4 days a week, and once a week for live audience taping.

When his father got ill with cancer, Lee got a job working at a nearby theater so he could be close to him. He chose to keep busy as much as he could, and it was during these years he would experience fantastic events like Star Wars nights where his friend would dress in a wookie costume and gain all the glory and fame from the theater crew and ticket purchasers. He collects original art pieces, Dungeons and Dragons miniatures and original manuals, and Star Wars memorabilia. The words that most often echo through his mind throughout his life are that of Master Yoda: "Don't think- DO." "You can cut all the flowers but you cannot keep spring from coming." ~ Pablo Neruda
